"INTERNATIONAL ENTREPRENEURSHIP--stimulating smarter successful small businesses world-wide"

This 30th ISBE Conference in Glasgow focuses on the renewed emphasis nationally and internationally on entrepreneurship in small, medium and large organisations. The theme of the Conference builds on the Scottish Government's policies to build a *'Smart Successful Scotland'*. The recently elected new First Minister for Scotland, Rt Hon Alex Salmond MSP, has written a personal welcome message to delegates in the ISBE Conference Programme just published. He says *"the commercial environment in Scotland, which is predominantly SME based, is thriving and highly supportive of new business ideas, reflecting the objectives of ISBE itself."* He commends this Conference as *"an excellent platform for debate and inspiration"*.

The theme of this Conference is applicable to many countries around the world and it has attracted a record level of interest. The numbers of speakers and papers expected are more than 40% up on last year whilst delegate enquiries and registrations are currently 25% up on last year. Over 40% of the papers submitted are from overseas authors, keen to exchange experiences with other countries. More than 600 delegates are expected – of which about 33% will be from overseas, compared with 25% from overseas last year.

The diversity within the field of small business and entrepreneurship lies at the heart of growth in many economies and the continuing emergence of new areas (e.g. social enterprise) present exciting challenges to policy makers, practitioners, educators and researchers. These issues are covered in a combination of plenary sessions, debates and technical paper presentations as follows:

- Excellence in Entrepreneurship Research led by Prof Robert Blackburn and colleagues
- Excellence in Entrepreneurship Practice led by Tony Robinson OBE and John Anderson.

TECHNICAL PAPERS

A key aim of ISBE 2007 is to continue the ISBE aim to bridge the gap between theory and practice in entrepreneurship and SME development and to highlight the **practical and policy implications** of recent research and experience. Another ISBE aim is to engage and share experiences with a wider *International Community*, recognising that entrepreneurs now operate on a global stage. Improving understanding of the contexts, policies and practices will not only inform support for SMEs domestically but also prepare them for the challenges on the wider global stage. Best practices should also be disseminated world-wide and this Conference aims to do so.

Around 250 technical papers will be presented in nine parallel tracks covering the following key themes:

- A Advancing entrepreneurship education and enterprise
- **B** Business birth-rate strategy stimulating start-ups
- C Community, ethnic, minority, rural and social enterprise
- E E-entrepreneurship, e-business and e-learning
- I Innovation, technology transfer and knowledge networks
- M Management, skills development and growth issues
- $\boldsymbol{S}\,$ Supporting small business development world-wide
- V Small business finance and financial management
- \boldsymbol{W} Women's enterprise & family enterprise development

Each Track will be led by experts in the field and sponsored by a relevant Organisation.

Last year the 29th Conference in Cardiff attracted 592 registrations, and the best Hotels and all the Conference places were fully booked some weeks before the event.
